Course Description:

Public international law is the law among nations. Countries (and other entities) are subject to international law in much the same way that people are subject to domestic law. International law imposes specific obligations and rights on nations, just as domestic law imposes them on individuals. Its purpose is similar to that of domestic law: eliminate international disorder by stipulating how states should behave towards each other. This one-credit seminar focuses on the Chinese thoughts and practice in public international law.
